Since its founding in 1977, GAHF has served as the national umbrella organization for Americans of German-speaking descent, who want to work together on vital issues and promote their heritage.

In March 2010, the German-American Heritage Foundation of the USA (GAHF) opened the German-American Heritage Museum (GAHM) as the first national inspiration for German American heritage and culture.

GERMAN AMERICAN IMPACT ON THE UNITED STATES **BEGAN LONG AGO AND CONTINUES TODAY**



KARL RAPP Creator of the **Original BMW Engine**

Karl Rapp founded Rapp Motorenwerke in 1913, which was later merged with Flugmaschinenfabrik Gustav Otto and renamed Bayerische Flugzeug-Werke AG (BFW) in 1916.



FELIX BAUMGARTNER

Austrian skydiver and daredevil who set three world records in the Red Bull Stratos project, in which he jumped from a capsule attached to a helium balloon in the stratosphere on October 14, 2012.



LENA HOSCHEK

Austrian fashion designer who studied with Vivienne Westwood, and combines nostalgic craftsmanship, lush fabrics, and feminine silhouettes. Launched in 2005. her designs are popular with celebrities like Sarah Jessica Parker, Christina Hendricks, Lana Del Ray, and Katy Perry.



HANS KÖNIGSMANN 2023 Distringuished **German American of the Year** and SpaceX Rocket Scientist

As the former Vice President of Flight Reliability and Build at SpaceX, he propelled the company from its humble beginnings as a startup to unprecedented heights including an official partnership with NASA.

EMMY NOETHER

A German mathematician who made many important contributions to abstract algebra, including Noether's Theorem, which explains the connection between symmetry and conservation laws, and quided modern physics.

Inventors of the Circuit Chip

These German engineers developed the idea of incorporating a silicon integrated circuit chip into a plastic smart card in the late 1960s. This concept laid the foundation for the chip-based credit cards we use today.



MARGARETHE **MEYER-SCHURZ**

German-born educator who established the very first kindergarten in Watertown, Wisc. from 1854-1856. The concept of kindergarten gradually spread throughout the U.S., and public schools eventually adopted it as the first year of formal elementary education.

EXHIBITS

Ever since the museum's inception in 2010, we have featured a number of exciting exhibits covering a wide range of topics. To celebrate our 50th anniversary, we are in the early planning stages for an exhibit on one of the most famous German-language children's books of all times: Johanna Spyri's, *Heidi*.



EVENTS & LECTURES

Although many of our in-person events take place at our museum in Washington, D.C., we also offer a number of virtual events and lectures.

Some topics featured ballroom dance lessons, a baking contest, lectures with filmmakers, historians, and authors, concerts with local and visiting musicians, German American Day walking tours along Washington, D.C.'s famous Mall, annual showing of *Die Feuerzangenbowle*, and of course, beer and wine tastings. The annual highlight of our event calendar is the Distinguished German American of the Year Award Gala which gives guests an opportunity to celebrate, network, and dance the night away.

SCHOLARSHIPS, INTERNSHIPS & EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH


